## City of Fairfax Band celebrates 40th anniversary

To be accurate, the City of Fairfax Band is actually approaching the 41st anniversary of its formation. The group's first concert was on the steps of City Hall in summer 1969.

But this year the band is celebrating its 40th anniversary season. Band members consider the two concerts scheduled in 1970 to be the all-volunteer musical group's first season, according to music director Robert Pouliot. "Although one of those was rained out," he said.

With the same humble beginnings as many community bands -- a group of people who played instruments in high school, college or the military getting together to keep up their musical chops -- the now 120-member City of Fairfax Band has grown to encompass a nationally recognized concert band and six other ensembles.

"I am sure that nobody would have imagined that the band would even still be around 40 years later," said Alan Cole, 67, a French horn player who has been with the band since its third year.

Thanks to the leadership of Thomas Hill, a George Mason University professor who took over the baton in 1971, the band moved toward a more professional direction, Cole said. Today Hill is the conductor emeritus.

"Just by his musicianship and leadership he really elevated the standard," Cole said. "Little by little, the band got good."

Hill recalls the band's roots as "a real community band," performing at nursing homes, schools and major events, such as the city's Fourth of July parade.

## City of Fairfax Band celebrates 40th anniversary

He compares the band's musical approach with that of the Boston Pops under the leadership of Arthur Fiedler, "but at a fraction of the cost."

"It's developed into a really fine concert band," said Hill, who still regularly attends the band's performances. "I frankly think it's one of the best community bands around."

The concert band still primarily performs in the auditorium of Fairfax High School. Season tickets to its concerts are \$45, free to students.

Accessibility to audiences is not the only community aspect the band has retained. Although the musicians are experienced and talented, they play for fun and for the love of music, Cole said.

"I enjoy playing old, familiar tunes; I enjoy learning tunes that are new and difficult for me," he said. "It's always exhilarating and gives a wonderful feeling of accomplishment every time."

The concert band has a waiting list for every section, so last year the organization launched the Main Street Community Band, an ensemble designed for people getting back into band music after a break. It has 60 members and has started having its own concerts.

Other ensembles include the Alte Kameraden German band, which primarily performs polka music; the Fairfax Swing Band; the Fairfax Saxophone Quartet; the Potomac Brass Quintet; and the Rebel Run Dixieland Band.

The band is celebrating its milestone throughout the season and will cap its 40th year with a gala concert at the GMU Center for the Arts on June 5. The program will feature Broadway stars Jodi Benson, Debbie Gravitte and Michael Maguire performing hit songs from musicals.
